SIKKIM GOVERNMENT COLLEGE, BURTUK- A BRIEF PROFILE

Established in July 2012 as the second campus of Sikkim Government College, Tadong, Sikkim Government College Burtuk (SGC) was established to provide higher education, better opportunities, and greater exposure to students in the state's capital, Gangtok. The college gained its separate identity when it got affiliated to Sikkim University on 12th August 2014. The college is a co-educational institution that primarily uses English and Colloquial language as its medium of instruction to facilitate the teaching-learning process.

The college attracts students with diverse backgrounds from within and outside the state and country, promoting healthy competitiveness, tolerance, and acceptance and enhancing the understanding of “unity in diversity” among students and the teaching fraternity. Initially, the college started with 179 students and eight teachers nestled in the annexure building of District Institute of Education and Training (DIET), Gangtok, East Sikkim. Currently, the college has its dedicated campus stretched along 3.5175 hectares, established in the Old India Press in Balwakhani Gangtok, as per the Office Order No GOS/HRDD/Hr.Edu/787/2012/26, Dated 10/07/2013. The college building is a heritage structure constructed by the then Chogyal (Maharaja of Sikkim) in 1960, and the college is blessed with a picturesque environment situated atop a lovely hill with a panoramic view of the entire Gangtok and mighty Kanchendzonga.

Sikkim Government College had its inaugural batch of students (2015-18) graduate in June 2018. The college conferred degrees to 209 Humanities graduates and 68 Commerce graduates, with an impressive pass percentage of 97.5% in both streams.

As of 2024-25, the student enrollment is 1374 with 47 faculties and 30 non-teaching staff. The college offers Honours courses in Commerce, English, Economics, Political Science, Education, History, Nepali, and Sociology. The college follows the semester system of education and offers Honours courses in both the Humanities and Commerce streams. The first batch of students graduated in 2016 with a pass percentage of 81.32 percent.

The institution's educational philosophy is centered around meeting the needs of each individual student. The college rewards excellent students with incentives and commendations while providing regular counseling and remedial sessions to weak and underperforming students through its student-mentor system. The faculty at Sikkim Government College, Burtuk, is committed to providing students with personal and comprehensive guidance and assistance in preparing them for life's challenges ahead.

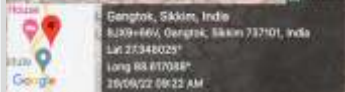
DISTINCTIVE TRAITS

1. National Education Policy, 2020

The Vision of NEP

This National Education Policy envisions an education system rooted in Indian ethos that contributes directly to transforming India, that is Bharat, sustainably into an equitable and vibrant knowledge society, by providing high-quality education to all, and thereby making India a global knowledge superpower. The Policy envisages that the curriculum and pedagogy of our institutions must develop among the students a deep sense of respect towards the Fundamental Duties and Constitutional values, bonding with one's country, and a conscious awareness of one's roles and responsibilities in a changing world. The vision of the Policy is to instil among the learners a deep-rooted pride in being Indian, not only in thought, but also in spirit, intellect, and deeds, as well as to develop knowledge, skills, values, and dispositions that support responsible commitment to human rights, sustainable development and living, and global well-being, thereby reflecting a truly global citizen.

2. Four-Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUP)

The National Education Policy 2020 has proposed for four years undergraduate programme. The traditional three-year UG degree is replaced by a flexible four-year undergraduate programme. The key features are as follows:

1. Multiple Entry and Multiple Exit (MEME): Students can exit the programme after 1st year, 2nd year and 3rd year i.e., in even semesters like 2nd semester, 4th semester, 6th semester. Students may re-enter 2nd year, and 3rd year i.e., in odd semester 3rd semester and 5th semester subject to credit validity and seat availability.

2. Academic Bank of Credits (ABC): A digital repository that stores academic credits earned by students across institutions, enabling credit transfer, accumulation, and redemption.
3. Choice-Based Credit System: Students choose major and disciplinary minor, along with ability enhancement courses, skill enhancement courses, value-added courses, and multi-disciplinary courses.
4. Integration of Online Learning: Up to 40% of courses may be completed through MOOCs (Massive Open Online Courses) offered through SWAYAM, an indigenous platform offered by the Government of India.
5. Outcome-Based Curriculum: The curriculum is based on learning outcomes, which the students have to achieve at the end of the course and the programme. It is aligned with the National Higher Education Qualification Framework (NHEQF) 2023, and credits as per NCrF2023.
6. Research Orientation: The fourth year introduces a research project or dissertation, preparing students for advanced study and innovation.

4. Understanding Credits

What is a Credit?

Under the National Credit Framework (NCrF):

- 1 Lecture Credit = 1 hour of instruction per week for 15 weeks (15 contact hours per semester).
- 1 Tutorial Credit = 1 hour per week for 15 weeks (15 contact hours per semester).
- 1 Practical/Lab/Field Credit = 2 hours per week for 15 weeks (30 contact hours per semester).

Each credit also assumes approximately 2 hours of self-study per contact hour, totalling approximately 30–45 notional learning hours per credit.

Multi-Disciplinary Courses (MDC)

For MDC, the students have to choose any three introductory-level courses relating to any of the broad disciplines given below. Students are not allowed to choose or repeat courses already undergone at the higher secondary level (12th class) in the proposed major and minor stream under this category. The basket of multi-disciplinary courses for FYUGP are offered as per the availability of resources in the institution and if is not available; it has to be covered through online platform.

9. Multiple Entry and Multiple Exit (MEME)

Flexibility in Your Academic Journey

One of the most significant features of NEP 2020 is the provision for Multiple Entry and Multiple Exit (MEME). This means students are no longer forced to complete the entire programme in one stretch. You may exit at a designated point with a valid qualification, and re-enter later to continue your education.

10. Re-Entry Provisions

- Students who exit at any point may re-enter the programme within the validity period of their credits (7 years) as stored in the Academic Bank of Credits (ABC).
- Re-entry is subject to seat availability and approval from the institution.
- Lateral entry is permitted at Year 2 and Year 3 (only if seats are available) and at Year 4 (as per the number of seats available and on merit, with a minimum of 75% marks in aggregate) for students holding the corresponding lower qualification.
- At the time of re-entry, students must fulfil any additional requirements of the revised curriculum in effect at that time.

11. Academic Bank of Credits (ABC)

Your Digital Academic Locker

The Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) is a national-level digital facility established by the Government of India under NEP 2020. It functions as a digital repository for storing and managing academic credits earned by students from any recognized institution in India.

Key Features of ABC

- **Credit Accumulation:** Credits earned at SGC, Burtuk (or any registered institution) are automatically deposited into the student's ABC account.
- **Credit Transfer:** Students can transfer credits between institutions at compatible levels of education.
- **Credit Validity:** Credits stored in the ABC are valid for 7 years from the date of earning.
- **Credit Redemption:** Credits are debited from the ABC account when a degree, diploma, or certificate is awarded.
- **Portability:** Enables students to move between institutions without losing academic progress.

How to Register for ABC

Mandatory for All Students

All students admitted to SGC, Burtuk must register on the Academic Bank of Credits portal. Registration should ideally be completed before or during the admission process.

- Register using your Aadhaar number and other details
- Note down your ABC ID — you will need this during admission
- Link your ABC account to SGC, Burtuk (Sikkim University)

12. SWAYAM and MOOCs Integration

Online Learning — A Key Pillar of NEP 2020

Under NEP 2020, up to 40% of the total credit requirement may be earned through online courses offered on the SWAYAM platform (Study Webs of Active-learning for Young Aspiring Minds), a Government of India initiative. This enables students to learn from the best national faculty and enriches the curriculum beyond what is available locally.

How SWAYAM/MOOCs Work at SGC, Burtuk

- Certain courses may be offered through SWAYAM.
- Each department has a designated MOOC Mentor who guides students in selecting appropriate courses and monitors their progress.
- Students must register on <https://swayam.gov.in> and enrol in the assigned course when notified.
- Course completion, including examinations conducted by the SWAYAM platform, will be credited to the student's academic record.
- The credits earned through SWAYAM must be equivalent to the offline credit value of the course they replace.

SWAYAM Registration Process

- Visit <https://swayam.gov.in> and create an account.
- Search for the course assigned by your MOOC Mentor.
- Enrol in the course during the enrolment window.
- Complete all modules, assignments, and examinations.
- Submit your SWAYAM certificate to the department for credit recognition.

13. Examination System

Assessment and Evaluation under NEP 2020

SGC, Burtuk follows the NEP-based assessment and evaluation system adopted by Sikkim University. The curriculum emphasizes continuous evaluation through formative assessments throughout the semester, complemented by a summative (end-term) examination. This approach ensures holistic measurement of student learning.

Assessment Pattern

Each course consists of both Formative Assessments (FA) and a Summative Assessment (SA):

- Formative Assessment (FA): Continuous evaluation is carried out through assignments, presentations, quizzes, class tests, and projects through Two Formative Assessments (FA-I & FA-II) respectively.
- Summative Assessment (SA): End-of-semester examination conducted under the supervision of the Controller of Examinations, Sikkim University.

Note: Certain types of courses (e.g., practicum, skill enhancement, field visits) may be assessed solely through formative assessments. The exact assessment pattern will be communicated by the respective department at the beginning of the semester.

14. University Regulations on Conduct of Examination

- A student who has applied for permission to sit for the examination, paid the examination fees, and attended at least 75% of the classes in a paper shall be eligible to sit for examination in that paper. However, if a student fails to score 75%, the Principal or the Dean of Students' Welfare on satisfying himself/herself about the genuineness of the case, may condone shortage of attendance by 5% if duly recommended by the concerned HoD. A student who is still short of attendance will repeat the entire examination in the next relevant semester.
- There shall be continuous evaluation of the progress of students throughout a semester in a manner approved by the Academic Council and an End-Term Examination at the end of each semester.
- A student may be allowed to repeat one or all papers in relevant semesters under the following circumstances:
 - If they fail in one or more papers.
 - If they are disqualified to appear in the End-Term Examination for two or fewer papers.

- If they seek to improve their performance.
- Provided that repeat examination of a particular paper is allowed only once and the result is not considered for any medal/prize/ranking.
- Students seeking to repeat a paper shall seek permission of the Controller of Examinations (CoE) through the HoD or Principal at least one month before the examination date and pay the prescribed fees at least one week before.

The curriculum of all programmes has been revised based on the Learning Outcome-Based Curriculum Framework (LOCF), aligned with the NHEQF 2023. Students may log on to www.cus.ac.in for detailed programme structure and curriculum

17. Minimum Eligibility for UG Programmes

- Candidates must have passed the Class XII (10+2) examination from a recognized Board/University.
- Candidates appearing for the Class XII examination may also apply; however, admission is subject to successful completion of the qualifying examination.
- Candidates must meet the subject-specific eligibility.

18. Selection Procedure

Admission to the UG programmes shall be based on merit, determined as follows:

- Overall Percentage of marks obtained in the qualifying examination (Class XII). The final merit list will be prepared by the Admission Committee and displayed on the college website and notice board.

20. Academic Counselling (During-Admission)

What Happens During Admission?

During the process of admission, every student will undergo Academic Counselling conducted by the respective department.

During this session:

- Students will finalize their Minor subject selection from available options.
- Students will be assigned Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC), Ability Enhancement Courses and the Multidisciplinary Courses.
- Students will be guided on MOOCs course enrolment for value added courses.
- A personalized program chart will be prepared showing the student's complete course map for the first year.
- Students will be guided on Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) registration.

21. How to Apply

- Upload the required documents as specified on the website.
- Pay the online application fee of Rs. 300/- through the prescribed method.

- Upon submission, the candidate will receive a confirmation slip. Please download the confirmation slip and bring it along with the listed documents if the candidate is selected for admission on the merit list.

23. Cancellation of Candidature

The following shall result in the cancellation of candidature after selection in the merit list, and the candidate shall lose their claim to the seat. Further, the seat will be declared vacant for counselling.

- Failure to report on the mentioned dates.
- Failure to meet the eligibility criteria.
- Failure to submit the requisite documents.
- Discrepancies found during document verification.

Failure to maintain disciplinary rules of the college.

24. Attendance

Mandatory Attendance Requirement

Students must attend a minimum of 75% of the class lectures in each course. Students whose attendance falls below the mandatory 75% will not be allowed to appear for the End-Semester Examination.

The Principal may condone a shortage of up to 5% on the recommendation of the Head of Department, in genuine cases only.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA FOR ADMISSION

Admission to our Honours Program is open to candidates who have successfully passed the class XII Final Examination of ISC/CBSE/WBCHSE or an examination equivalent to 10+2 of CBSE. Please note that once a student opts for a specific Honours course, it cannot be changed or dropped. Selection of candidates will be based on merit and the seat capacity of the institution.

RESERVATION POLICY FOR ADMISSION

- 1) 85% of the intake capacity of the college will be reserved for the local candidates (who have valid documents like COI, SSC/Domicile and the rest 10% will be allotted to Residential Certificate holders (as defined by the new notification) and 5% of intake capacity will be allotted to wards of Central Government employees(Non-Local), army personnel, CPMF transferred and working in Sikkim at the time of admission of their ward.
- 2) 5% of the total intake capacity in each programme of all colleges will be reserved for differently able students on the basis of the merit list generated. However, if the quota for differently able students remains vacant it will be given to general students.
- 3) After allocation of seats to local and Residential Certificate holders, if any seat is available, it will be allotted to non-local candidates (not having domicile, COI or any form of Residential Certificate issued by a competent authority or those who are not the wards of Central Government employees, army personnel, CPMF transferred and working in Sikkim at the time of admission of their ward.)
- 4) Vocational students seeking admission in the college should have a minimum of 70% for B.A. Programme. Only vocational students with accountancy or retail management in 10+2 will be admitted to B.Com. Programme.
- 5) Students who have studied Commerce & Science at 10+2 can apply for B. Com. and B.A. Students who have studied Humanities at 10+2 can apply for B.A., but not B.Com.
- 6) Students with Compartment result in 10+2 are not entitled to apply for any course in any Government College.
- 7) During seat allocation, priority will be given to the student's choice of college first and then choice of subjects.
- 8) Marks obtained in non-traditional subjects (listed in Page 6) shall not be considered for calculation of percentage as it will deprive genuine students opting for traditional subjects.

FEE STRUCTURE

The Government of Sikkim has relaxed fees for students hailing from Sikkim (SSC/COI/RC) since Academic Session 2014-2015. As per the Notification No. 58/DIR(HE)HRDD dated 20/05/2015 and its partial modification dated 27/05/2016 by the Office Order No. 25/DIR(HE)/HRDD, students pursuing undergraduate courses are required to pay a registration fee of Rs. 700/- directly to the affiliating university in favour of Sikkim University from the academic year 2015-2016 and onwards.

STUDENT SUPPORT

ANTI-RAGGING COMMITTEE

As per the order of Supreme Court of India and subsequent Notification from University Grants Commission (UGC), ragging constitutes one or more of any intention by any student or group of students on:

- ♦ Any act of indiscipline, teasing or handling with rudeness.
- ♦ Any act that prevents, disrupts the regular academic activity.
- ♦ Any act of financial extortion or forceful expenditure.
- ♦ Any activity which is likely to cause annoyance, hardship, psychological harm or creates fear or apprehension.
- ♦ Any act of abuse by spoken words, emails, Whatsapp, SMS or public insult etc.
- ♦ Any act of injury or infringement of the fundamental right to the human dignity.
- ♦ Any act of physical abuse causing assault, harm or danger to Health.
- ♦ Any Act of wrongful confinement, kidnapping, molesting or committing unnatural offences, use of criminal forces, trespass or intimidation.
- ♦ Any unlawful assembly or conspiracy to ragging.

PUNISHMENT PROVISIONS

Any student or group of students found guilty of ragging on campus or off campus shall be liable to one or more of the following punishments:

- Debarred from appearing in any sessional test/ university examination or withholding results
- Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges
- Withdrawing scholarships and other benefits
- Suspension from the college for a period of one month
- Cancellation of admission
- Debarred from representing the institution in any national or international meet, tournament, youth festival, etc
- Rustication from the institution for periods varying from 1 to 4 semesters or equivalent period
- Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution

The College has established an Anti-Ragging Committee and Anti-Ragging Squads to ensure compliance with the UGC Regulations and

Sikkim University Anti-Ragging Rules, 2009. These bodies are responsible for overseeing and regulating anti-ragging activities in various areas of the College, including Hostels, Library and Canteens. The Principal serves as the ex-officio Chairman of the Anti-Ragging Committee, while the Dean of Students' Welfare is the ex-officio Chairman of the Anti-Ragging Squad. In case of any complaint, students can approach the office of the Principal, Dean of Students' Affairs, or Head of the Department of the concerned subject.

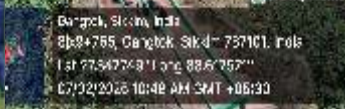
NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (NSS)

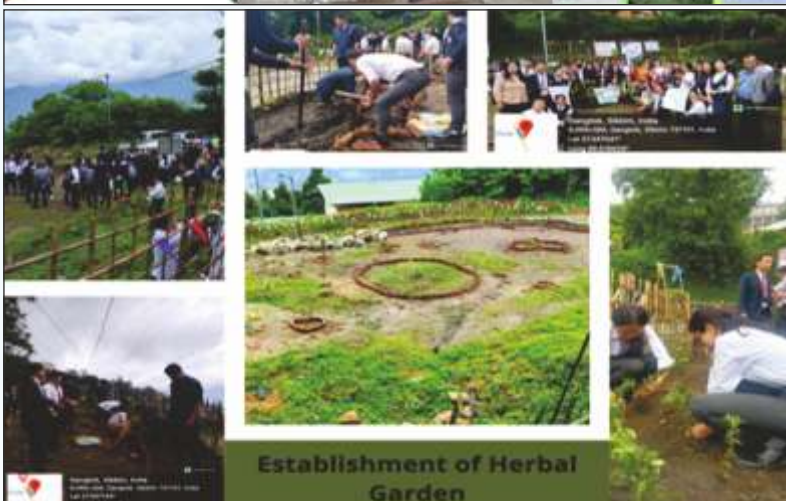
ECO CLUB

STUDENTS REPRESENTATIVE COUNCIL

The College has established a functional Students Representative Council (SRC) that operates under the guidance of the Dean of Students' Affairs. The SRC is responsible for arranging co-curricular and welfare events within the campus to ensure optimal performance in promoting student welfare but can be disbanded by the Chairperson if there are any constitutional breaches. The SRC is chaired by the Principal and offers students a platform to express their needs and requests. The SRC comprises elected student representatives, and annual elections are held to allow students to contest and win positions in the council. The SRC also coordinates the Annual College Festival "VIBES", which features a variety of activities such as dance, music, drama, food festivals and fashion shows.



RULES AND REGULATIONS OF SIKKIM GOVERNMENT COLLEGE, BURTUK

Students/Parents/Guardians should acquaint themselves thoroughly with the following rules :

1. Students must strictly observe and follow all the rules, regulations, and traditions of the College.
2. All students must conduct themselves befitting their status as students of the College both within and outside the campus. They are answerable to the Principal for their behaviour in general and within the College campus in particular.
3. Insubordination or misconduct of any kind, indecent gestures or remarks, offensive graffiti or pestering misuse of electronic media like Facebook, Instagram, Twitter, WhatsApp, etc. to malign the College and teachers will be viewed as a serious breach of discipline. Such cases will be dealt with severely, and the defaulter will be expelled from the Institution without any notice.
4. Smoking, gambling, use or possession of alcohol/drugs by the students is prohibited at all times. Such cases, regardless of circumstances, will result in immediate expulsion without any further appeal for readmission.
5. Students are expected to acquaint themselves regularly with the information displayed on the College notice boards.
6. No fund collection for any purpose whatsoever shall be allowed in the College without the explicit permission of the Principal.
7. Students are not allowed to hold any meeting or rallies, invite guests or arrange for any person to address any gathering in the campus without the prior permission of the Principal.
8. Students must carry their Identity Card with them at all times as they may be asked to produce the same at any time.
9. Any person, people, or students other than the authorized official/staff, if found mishandling the College gate and property will be automatically subjected to law and the Police.
10. Students living on their own must make satisfactory living arrangements with a local guardian approved of by the Principal.
11. Students requiring railway/air travel concessions should apply to the Principal in the appropriate form(s) at least three days in advance. Requests for immediate issue of such concession will not be entertained.
12. Students are required to be dressed in proper uniform when in College.

13. Each student shall conduct herself/himself, both within and outside the campus of the College, in a manner befitting a student of a prestigious College. Each student shall show due respect and courtesy to the teachers, administrators, staff of the College, and to the visitors and residents of the College, and good behaviour to their peers.
14. Lack of courtesy and decorum, unbecoming conduct within and outside the College, wilful damage to College property, removal of any property belonging to the College, fellow students or other personnel and residents of the College, use of abusive language, disturbing fellow students in their studies, breach of rules and regulations of the College, adoption of unfair practices in tests, quizzes, assignments, or examinations, noisy and unruly behaviour, etc. shall constitute a violation of the code of conduct.
15. Loud talking, loitering or congregating, being a source of distraction and annoyance to others is not permitted.
16. Use of cell phones is strictly prohibited in all academic areas of the campus. Its use would entail confiscation of the handset. It would be returned only at the end of the course or after a settlement with the Principal and Discipline Committee along with the defaulter's Parents.
17. Students will not operate any machinery/equipment without the permission of the instructor.
18. No responsibility will be accepted by the College for any injury, loss, or damage to the personal articles of students.
19. It is compulsory for the students to attend functions/activities organized by the College on various occasions, in proper College uniform, whether the function falls on a working day or on holiday unless notified otherwise. Absence from such function without valid reasons will invite disciplinary action.
20. Participating in ragging, political activities, or engaging in any conduct that is harmful to the reputation of the College is strictly prohibited for students. Any student found be violating this rule or causing disrepute to the College will face expulsion.
21. The college expects its students to respect the college property and take care of it. If any damage is caused to the college property or furniture due to the student's neglect or wilful act, the student will have to compensate for the same. The college takes the defacing of its property walls very seriously and any student found doing so will be subjected to disciplinary action.

22. The college expects its students to be responsible and conserve resources like electricity and water. Students should make all possible efforts to conserve electricity and water by switching off lights and fans when not in use. They must also help keep the college neat and clean, and maintain the gardens.
23. The college has a strict policy against smoking, alcohol, and drugs on campus. Any student found violating this policy will face strict disciplinary action, which may lead to expulsion from the college.
24. The college expects its students to keep themselves informed about the latest developments and notices related to the college. The notices displayed on the college/hostel notice boards will be considered as being served to the students. Therefore, students are advised to regularly check the notices displayed on the notice boards.
25. Any of the above listed offence attracts a mandatory punching of the Identity Card by the Discipline Committee members. If the number of punches reaches 3 (three) then he/she shall be automatically rusticated from the College.
26. The Convener, Discipline Committee, in consultation with the committee members and with the approval of Principal, reserves the right to modify any of the College rules as and when necessary.
27. The decision of the Principal in all matters shall be final.
28. Any student(s) involved in verbal or physical assault with teaching or non-teaching members of the institution if guilty will be rusticated or expelled from the College. Names of the defaulters will be reported by the Discipline Committee.
29. Character Certificate will be issued by the Head of the Institution on receipt of clearance from the College Discipline Committee.
30. Smoking and consumption of tobacco or any intoxicating or narcotic substance is strictly prohibited in the campus. The defaulter will be fined Rs. 500/- on the spot or imprisonment upto 6 months and may lead to rustication from the College.

The Importance of Internet Ethics at SGC, Burtuk

In today's digital age, social media platforms have become popular mediums for students to express their opinions, share photos, and videos. At SGC, we expect all students to adhere to internet ethics and respect the rights, prestige, and reputation of the college, its teachers, and the local culture of Sikkim. Any violation of internet ethics will result in disciplinary action as deemed fit by the college, depending on the severity of the violation.

STATUTE RELATING TO MAINTENANCE OF DISCIPLINE AMONGST THE STUDENTS/VISITORS OF THE COLLEGE

1. Powers relating to discipline and disciplinary action are vested in the Discipline Committee appointed by the Principal. Further, every staff member has authority to prevent disorderly behaviour in the premises of the College.
2. Without prejudice to the generality of power to enforce discipline under the ordinances, the following shall amount to acts of gross indiscipline:
 - a) Coming to College without proper College uniform.
 - b) Coming to College with indecent hair style, the type and length of which has been specified by the Discipline Committee.
 - c) Ragging in any form in the premises of the College.
 - d) Physical assault or threat to use physical force against any member of the teaching/non-teaching staff of the College and against any student or member of public within premises of the College.
 - e) Carrying or threats to use any weapon with an intention to cause injury to any students/staff/visitor of the College.
 - f) Any violation of the provisions of the Civil Rights Protection Act, 1976. Violation of the status, dignity and honour of any student.
 - g) Any practice, whether verbal or otherwise, derogatory to women.
 - h) Any attempt of bribery or corruption in any manner.
 - i) Willful destruction of College property.
 - j) Creating ill will or intolerance on religious or communal grounds.
3. Unauthorized entry within the College premises is strictly prohibited. If any person is found within the College premises without proper permission and he/she fails to satisfy the Discipline Committee about the intent of his/her visit, then it will be considered as a violation of the conduct of the College and their case may be reported to the nearest police station/outpost. This is also applicable for vehicles other than those permitted by the College authorities.
4. Without prejudice to the generality of its powers relating to the maintenance of discipline and taking such action in the interest as may deem appropriate, the Discipline Committee may, in the exercise of its powers aforesaid, order or direct:

- a. That any student(s) be expelled, or for a stated period, rusticated, or not allowed to attend a course or courses of study in a Department of the College for a stated period. Be fined, be debarred from giving a departmental examination or University Examination.
 - b. That the result of the student(s) concerned, in the examination(s) in which he/she appeared be withheld or cancelled.
 - c. That the student(s) be suspended from the College till completion of pending enquiry.
5. The College Authorities shall have authority to exercise all such disciplinary powers over students as they may find necessary for proper conduct of the College.
 6. Without prejudice to the powers of the Discipline Committee, detailed rules of discipline and proper conduct in class rooms/laboratories/College campus may be supplemented where necessary by Heads of the Departments. Each student is expected to study and follow these rules.
 7. At the time of admission, every student shall be required to sign a declaration that on admission he/she submits himself/herself to the disciplinary jurisdiction of the Discipline Committee and other authorities of the College who may be vested with the authority to exercise discipline under the rules and regulations that have been framed by the College.
